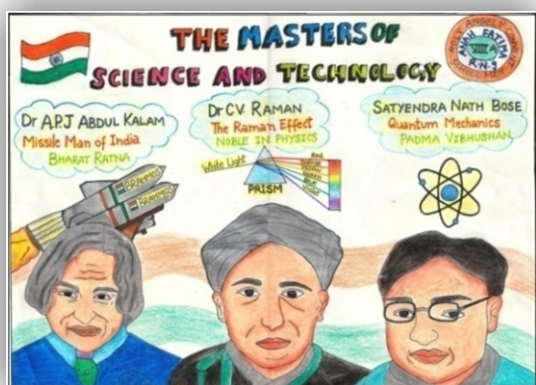

YOGA HEALS THE SOUL INTERNATIONAL DAY OF YOGA

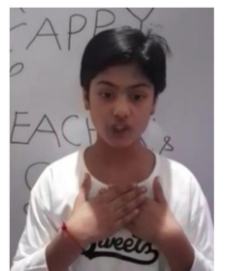
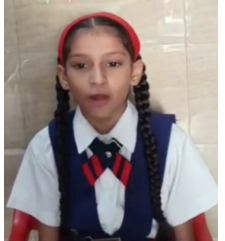
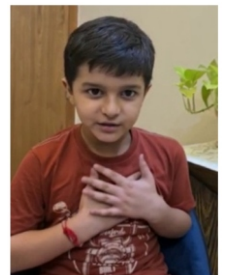

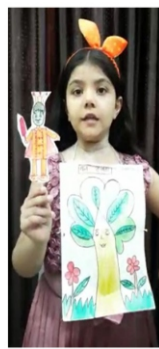
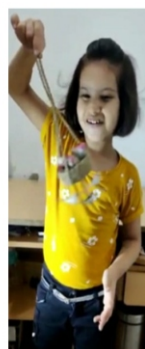
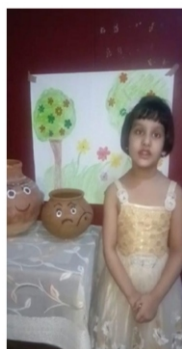
(Jan Andolan) called the Rashtriya Poshan Maah (National Nutrition Month) in the month of September.

Not only that the other online aspects like shopping, banking, digital payments etc also lead to various unfortunate things like larceny, fraud etc. In order to make the students aware of the crimes that happen on the digital platforms, our school organized a seminar in association with the district Cyber Crime Cell for the students of classes 6 to 12 in the school auditorium by following all the Covid protocols strictly. This event was held on 5th January, 2022 and was headed by the inspector of the Cell, Mr. Sanjeev Bhatnagar and sub-inspector Mr. Gaurav Chouhan who elaborated about the crimes and frauds that take place online. After the welcome address, Mr. Bhatnagar briefed about the online banking outlaws and the ways and means to escape from them. He also explained in detail through a short video about the ATM hackers and the means they use to trick the elders and youngsters. He advised everyone to frame a strong password to protect from these illegal hackers. Mr. Chouhan illustrated the illegal activities that take place on social media platforms and he advised the students not to indulge in too much of these activities and to handle them with care under the guidance of the elders. The helpline numbers of the Crime Cell were shared with the assemblage. Both the officers were thanked for their outstanding efforts and presented with mementos at the end. A STEP TOWARDS SAFETY **COVID VACCINATION CAMP, FIRST AND SECOND DOSE**
